I remember each of you in my prayers every day during this very difficult time as we deal with the Coronavirus. Many of you are hurting in various ways due to the pandemic. I pray that God will watch over and care for each of you.

St. Thomas has begun public Masses again. We have Masses at our regularly scheduled times on the weekdays and on the weekends.

We are following social distancing procedures. We have face masks available, and all who attend Mass are required to use a face mask. We are disinfecting the Church after the Masses.

**You are not required to attend Mass.** Bishop Raica has offered a dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass to all Catholics in the diocese due to the pandemic until November 22nd.. St. Thomas offers a Mass each weekend that will be available through a link on the St. Thomas website. We hope to have this posted on Sunday morning, and we hope that you will use this virtual liturgy for your family worship each weekend.

## Rite of Christian Initiation

St. Thomas Parish has begun sessions for those who are interested in receiving sacraments of initiation. The process is called the Rite of Christian Initiation. This RCIA process is for people who have not been baptized, people who have been baptized in another Christian tradition who wish to become Catholic, and adult Catholics who have been baptized, but who have not been confirmed.

The RCIA will offer in-person sessions. The sessions will be on Sundays from 9:30 AM until 10:45 AM. The sessions in English will meet in the Parish Hall, and the sessions in Spanish will meet in the St. Joseph's Room. Due to the need for social distancing, the only people who will be able to attend these sessions will be the candidates, their spouses, and their sponsors.

### Statement from Bishop Steven Raica 10/22

I have heard the media reports about statements allegedly made by Pope Francis in a recent documentary in Italy. I have not seen the documentary, heard the questions that were asked of the Holy Father, or been able to verify whether his responses were accurately conveyed in their proper context. In any case, it appears, as the matter comes into greater focus, that he was in no way aiming to change Church teaching about human sexuality and marriage, but instead was offering his prudential judgment on matters of public policy concerning those who seek same-sex civil unions. Furthermore, the Pope's previous statements on this issue make clear that he in no way regards civil unions as the equivalent of marriage, which ought to be privileged in society, since it is the only institution essentially ordered to the procreation and education of children.

Here in the Diocese of Birmingham, we remain committed to promoting the Church's beautiful teachings on marriage, family, and sexuality, as well as insisting that all people be shown respect and compassion. As we await possible clarification or further elucidation from the Vatican on the pronouncements attributed to the Holy Father, let us remember to keep him and his important mission in our daily prayers.

### Angel Tree

Despite the hurdles presented by COVID-19, the St. Thomas Angel Tree Project will carry on this year. However, we will follow a different format than in the past. We will be unable to have our traditional tree in the Gathering Space, due to the risks of exposure to the Coronavirus. Our Social Concerns Committee and Father Ray still want to help those in our community whose children might otherwise miss a visit from Santa Claus.

As a COVID-19 recoverer himself, Father Ray expressed deep concern for the many parishioners who might be putting themselves at risk by shopping in crowded stores. For this year only, we are planning a completely financial project, and your help and support--and contributions-- are greatly needed. We plan to assist client-families with children from Shelby Emergency Assistance and the Bibb County Department of Human Resources. Our goal is to provide the agencies with \$150 per child (for six "wants" and six "needs.") The funds raised at St. Thomas will be given to the sponsoring agencies to buy gift cards. The families can use these cards to buy gifts on their children's lists. Please be as generous as you have always been in the past. And let's help these youngsters have a Merry Christmas!
