Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue our month of reflection on stewardship with a Gospel that challenges us to think about our priorities in life—what are we putting first? The Kingdom of God isn't just about following certain rules (like the 10 Commandments) but also about putting certain things ahead of others.

There's an old but handy rule of thumb about our top priorities in life: God, family, and our neighbors. Our response to God has to come first, because he is the source of all good, and because without his support, we won't have the strength to truly care for the others in our lives. Remember Jesus' promise of blessings for those who put him first: "There is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands, for my sake and for the Gospel, who will not receive a hundredfold."

Family is often considered the next top priority, and for good reason: when we say "family," we're saying that God calls us to stay focused on the vocation he has called us into. Other work (including our jobs) exists to help us serve others, not for us to accumulate material goods.

And third on that list, we find our neighbors—neighbors in Jesus' sense, of everyone God has placed in our lives. Serving those beyond our family circle often involves sacrifice above and beyond the sacrifices we make for our family, but that kind of sacrifice shapes us more deeply into the image of Christ, who showed the greatest love of all when he "gave up his life for his friends."

Through the intercession of St. Thomas and Our Lady, may each of us seek to follow more deeply Jesus' call to love him above all things—and let's trust in the Lord's promise of blessings, as we respond to his call.

Resumption of Sunday Mass Obligation

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Bishop Raica had offered a dispensation from the requirement to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the Diocese of Birmingham until May 23. On May 3, Bishop Raica promulgated a decree restoring the obligation beginning on May 24.

Every Catholic is required to attend Mass unless they are excused for a serious reason. In relation to COVID-19, serious reasons include:

- Being in a high-risk category
- Being advised by a medical doctor that it is not yet safe for you to attend
- Experiencing a significant amount of mental stress regarding returning.

It is always possible to receive a dispensation from one's Pastor. Father Jantz is happy to talk with anyone who is concerned about returning to public worship.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Hoy continuamos nuestro mes de reflexión sobre la corresponsabilidad, a través de un Evangelio que nos desafía a pensar en nuestras prioridades en la vida. ¿Qué ponemos primero? El Reino de Dios no se trata solo de seguir ciertas reglas (como los Diez Mandamientos), sino también de tener ciertas prioridades.

Existe una regla, antigua pero útil, sobre nuestras principales prioridades en la vida: Dios, la familia y nuestro prójimo. Nuestra respuesta a Dios tiene que ser primero, porque él es la fuente de todo bien y porque sin su apoyo, no tendremos la fuerza para cuidar a los demás en nuestras vidas. Recuerden la promesa de bendiciones para aquellos que lo ponen en primer lugar: “nadie que haya dejado casa, hermanos, hermanas, madre, padre, hijos o hacienda por mí y por el Evangelio, quedará sin recibir el ciento por uno.”

Consideramos la familia nuestra siguiente prioridad principal. Cuando decimos “familia,” estamos diciendo que Dios nos llama a permanecer enfocados en nuestra vocación en la vida. Otro trabajo existe para ayudarnos a servir a los demás, no para que acumulemos bienes materiales.

Y en tercer lugar en esa lista, encontramos a nuestros vecinos: todos los que Dios ha puesto en nuestras vidas. Servir a los que están más allá de nuestro círculo familiar a menudo implica un verdadero sacrificio. Ese tipo de sacrificio nos moldea a la imagen de Cristo, quien mostró el mayor amor cuando “entregó su vida por nosotros, sus amigos.”

Por la intercesión de Santo Tomás y Nuestra Señora, que cada uno de nosotros siga más profundamente el llamado de Jesús de amarlos sobre todas las cosas—y confiemos en la promesa de bendiciones del Señor.
