



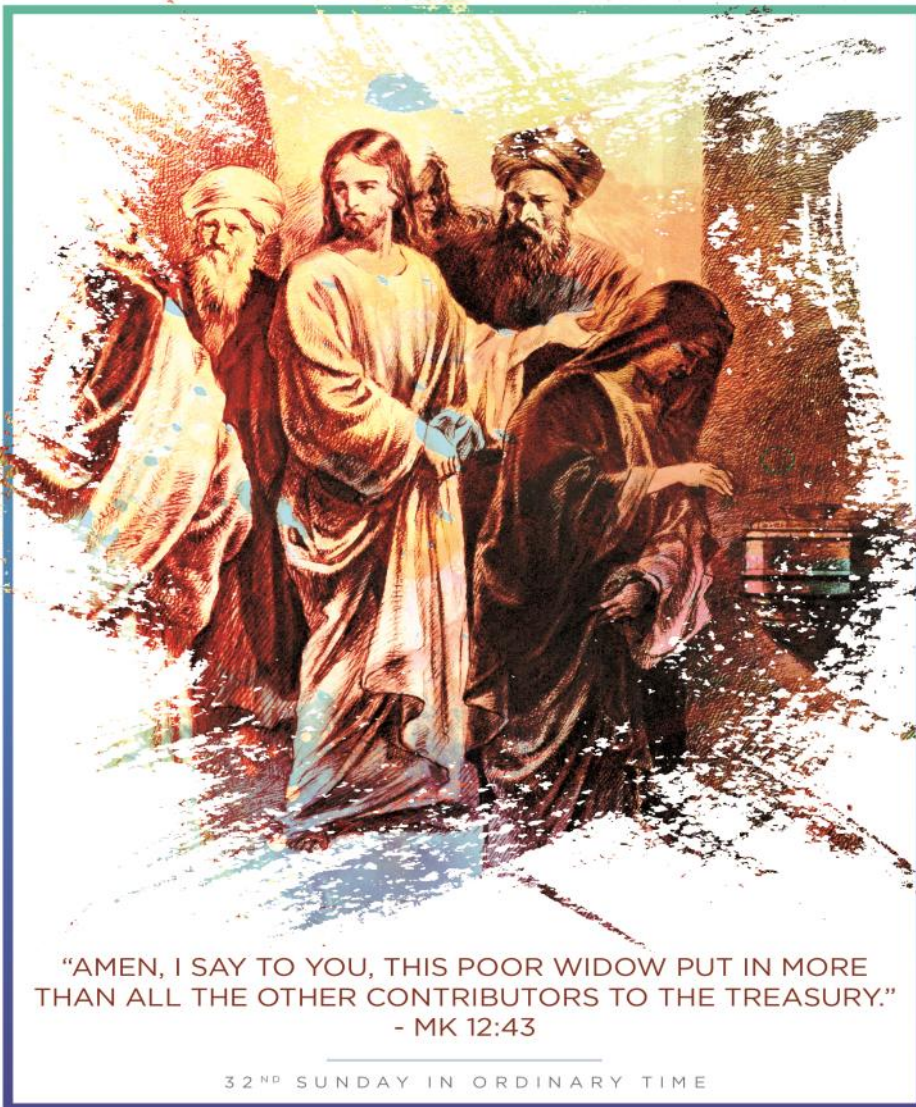

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

During the month of November, our focus turns to eternity. In the natural world around us, we see the leaves changing colors and falling from the trees. The air gets colder and the days become shorter—a reminder of the limits of the goods of this world and the shortness of our own lives.

Even within the Church, our focus moves to eternity, as we meditate upon the Last Things (death, judgment, hell, and heaven). In the first week of November, we're especially encouraged to remember our beloved dead. We observed All Souls' Day on 2 November, and our Saturday Vigil Mass on 6 November is also dedicated to the memories of the faithful departed.

Beyond our community's celebration of Mass, I would encourage everyone to make a visit to a cemetery this month—perhaps one where friends or family members are buried. While you're there, be sure to say a prayer for the dearly departed. For any Catholic who makes a prayerful visit to a cemetery this month, a plenary indulgence is available—a special grace to help us get free from the effects of sin. To receive it, just make the visit, make a good Confession, receive Communion, and say a prayer for Pope Francis, as well.

As we enter this month of meditation upon the Last Things, I pray that each member of this community receives the gift of God's consolation for their dearly departed. Join me in praying for them to arrive swiftly at heaven's gates, through the intercession of Mary, the Queen of the Saints, and our patron St. Thomas.

Resumption of Sunday Mass Obligation

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Bishop Raica had offered a dispensation from the requirement to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the Diocese of Birmingham until May 23. On May 3, Bishop Raica promulgated a decree restoring the obligation beginning on May 24.

Every Catholic is required to attend Mass unless they are excused for a serious reason. In relation to COVID-19, serious reasons include:

- Being in a high-risk category
- Being advised by a medical doctor that it is not yet safe for you to attend
- Experiencing a significant amount of mental stress regarding returning.

It is always possible to receive a dispensation from one's Pastor. Father Jantz is happy to talk with anyone who is concerned about returning to public worship.

Catholic Charities Weekend Thank You

We celebrated Catholic Charities and Communities weekend on Sept. 25-26. This special appeal funds the programs of the Diocese of Birmingham. Book of Remembrance

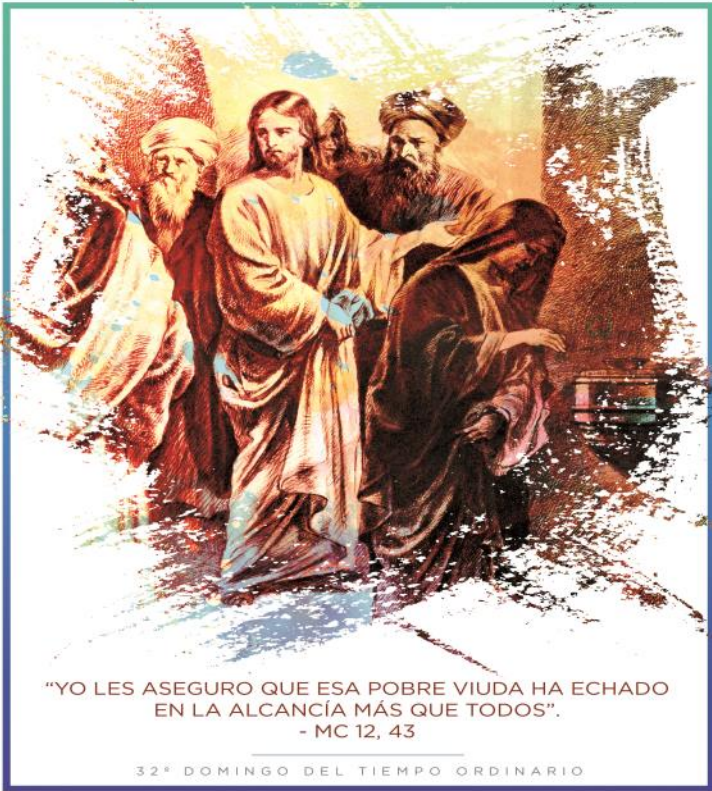
