Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This Sunday's Gospel tells the story of the Transfiguration: the moment when Jesus went to pray upon a mountaintop with his three closest friends, and those disciples had a vision of Jesus' true identity. Reflecting on the story this week in light of our Lenten observances, I think it's a good opportunity to talk about prayer: specifically, how prayer *changes* things.

First, prayer changes *our perspective*: by taking the focus off ourselves and looking toward God's perspective, we become aware of how his presence is all around us. This is true even when we don't receive an immediate or obvious answer to a prayer request—having the confidence of entrusting everything to God.

Second, prayer changes *us*: when we entrust our needs to God, and when we listen carefully for his voice, we become the sort of people that the Gospel calls us to be. Seeing the world as God sees it—with love, with mercy—allows us to live the life of the Beatitudes, transfigured by the working of the Spirit.

Third, prayer changes *the world*: we call God all-powerful for a reason! And through prayer, he allows us to participate in his plans. People with the confidence of God's children, who have been transformed by an encounter with him, will make the greatest possible difference for those around them.

So with all that, I think this weekend is a good time for each of us to commit to deeper prayer this Lent. If you've already carved out some space in your schedule (maybe by fasting from a favorite activity), prayer is just the thing to put in its place. As we're sustained by the continual prayers of Blessed Mary Ever-Virgin and St. Thomas, let's ourselves become people of deeper prayer.

Resumption of Sunday Mass Obligation

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Bishop Raica had offered a dispensation from the requirement to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the Diocese of Birmingham until May 23. On May 3, Bishop Raica promulgated a decree restoring the obligation beginning on May 24.

Every Catholic is required to attend Mass unless they are excused for a serious reason. In relation to COVID-19, serious reasons include:

- Being in a high-risk category
- Being advised by a medical doctor that it is not yet safe for you to attend
- Experiencing a significant amount of mental stress regarding returning.

It is always possible to receive a dispensation from one's Pastor. Father Jantz is happy to talk with anyone who is concerned about returning to public worship.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

El Evangelio de este domingo cuenta la historia de la Transfiguración: el momento cuando Jesús fue a orar a la cima de una montaña con sus tres amigos más cercanos, y esos discípulos tuvieron una visión de la verdadera identidad de Jesús. Reflexionando sobre el Evangelio de esta semana a la luz de nuestras celebraciones de Cuaresma, creo que es una buena oportunidad para hablar sobre cómo la oración cambia las cosas.

Primero, la oración cambia *nuestra perspectiva*: al quitar nuestro foco egoísta y mirar con la perspectiva de Dios, nos damos cuenta de cómo su presencia está con nosotros todo el tiempo. Esto es cierto incluso cuando no recibimos una respuesta inmediata u obvia a una oración, porque aprendamos la confianza de confiar todo a Dios.

Segundo, la oración *nos* cambia: cuando confiamos nuestras necesidades a Dios, y cuando escuchamos atentamente su voz, nos convertimos en el tipo de personas que el Evangelio nos llama a ser. Ver el mundo como Dios lo ve—con amor, con misericordia—nos permite vivir la vida de los Evangelios, transfiguradas por la obra del Espíritu.

Tercero, la oración cambia *el mundo*: ¡decimos que Dios es todopoderoso por una razón! Y a través de la oración, Él nos permite participar en sus planes. Las personas con la confianza de los hijos de Dios, que han sido transformados por un encuentro con Él, harán la mayor diferencia posible para quienes nos rodean.

Entonces, creo que este fin de semana es un buen momento para un compromiso más profundo a la oración esta Cuaresma. Si ya has creado algo de espacio en su horario (tal vez ayunando de una actividad favorita), la oración es lo que puedes poner en su lugar. Sostenidos por las oraciones continuas de la Beata María Siempre Virgen y de Santo Tomás, profundicemos nuestro compromiso a la oración esta Cuaresma.
