



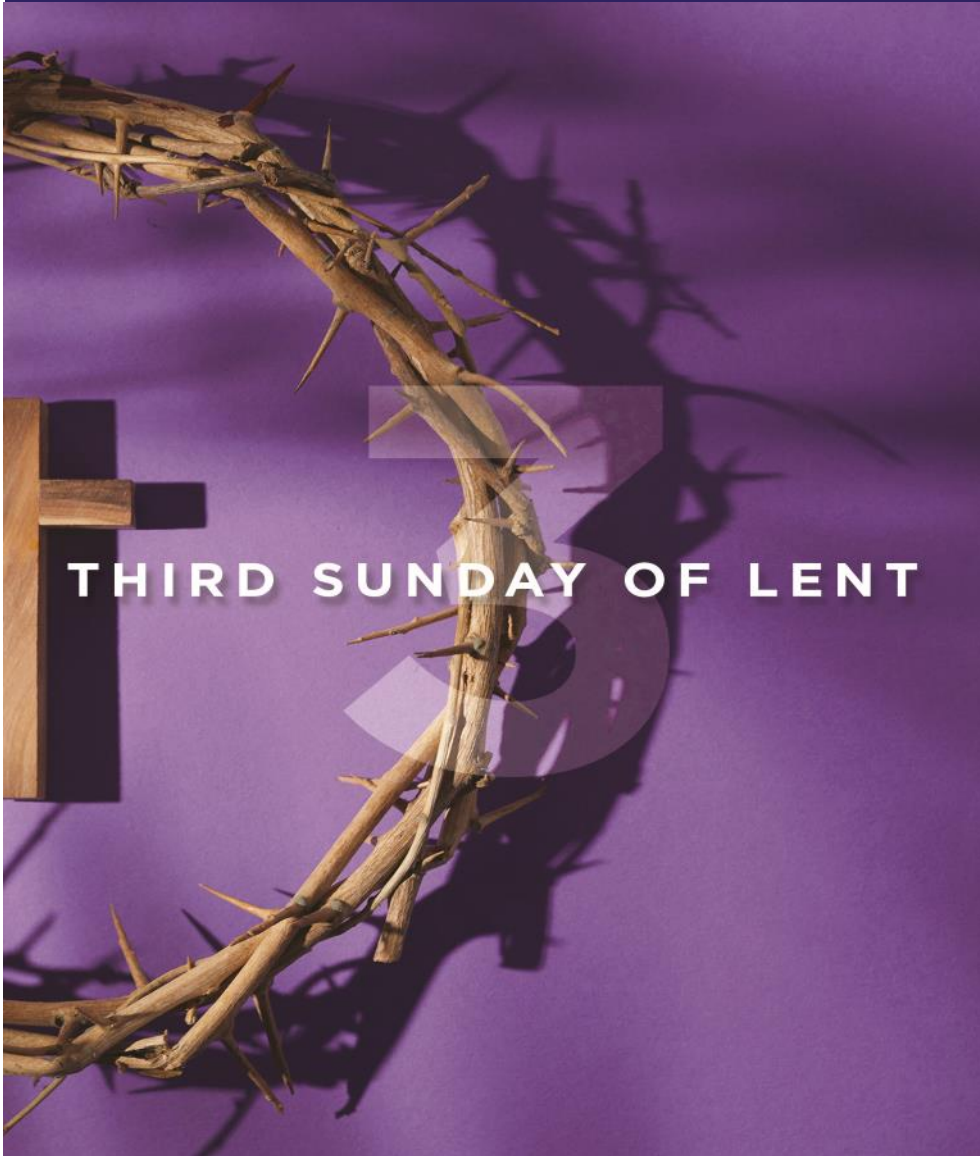

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope everyone's Lent is continuing to go well! I'll be down in Clanton this weekend, but I know that Fr. Lody and Fr. Cook will take great care of everyone. Be sure to say hello to Fr. Lody, our associate pastor, if you haven't had a chance to meet him yet!

Today's Gospel tells about parable from Jesus about the way generosity factors into our Lenten practices of prayer and fasting. A gardener has a fig tree that just won't bear fruit, regardless of how much he fertilizes it. Have you ever felt like your spiritual life is like that tree? You make the effort, but things just feel dry, for some reason. In that case, generosity—and especially the corporal works of mercy—might be the solution!

Here's an explanation of why, from a sermon of St. Peter Chrysologus (an Italian bishop who lived around the year 400). He once wrote, "Mercy is to fasting as rain is to the ground. However much you may cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, and sow virtues, if you do not release the water of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit."

The point here isn't that we should live in fear, constantly wondering if we're doing enough, but rather that opening our hearts to our neighbor goes hand-in-hand with opening our hearts to God. Through the intercession of Blessed Mary Ever-Virgin and St. Thomas our patron, let's open our hands in mercy, this Lent and always.

Resumption of Sunday Mass Obligation

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Bishop Raica had offered a dispensation from the requirement to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the Diocese of Birmingham until May 23. On May 3, Bishop Raica promulgated a decree restoring the obligation beginning on May 24.

Every Catholic is required to attend Mass unless they are excused for a serious reason. In relation to COVID-19, serious reasons include:

- Being in a high-risk category
- Being advised by a medical doctor that it is not yet safe for you to attend
- Experiencing a significant amount of mental stress regarding returning.

It is always possible to receive a dispensation from one's Pastor. Father Jantz is happy to talk with anyone who is concerned about returning to public worship.

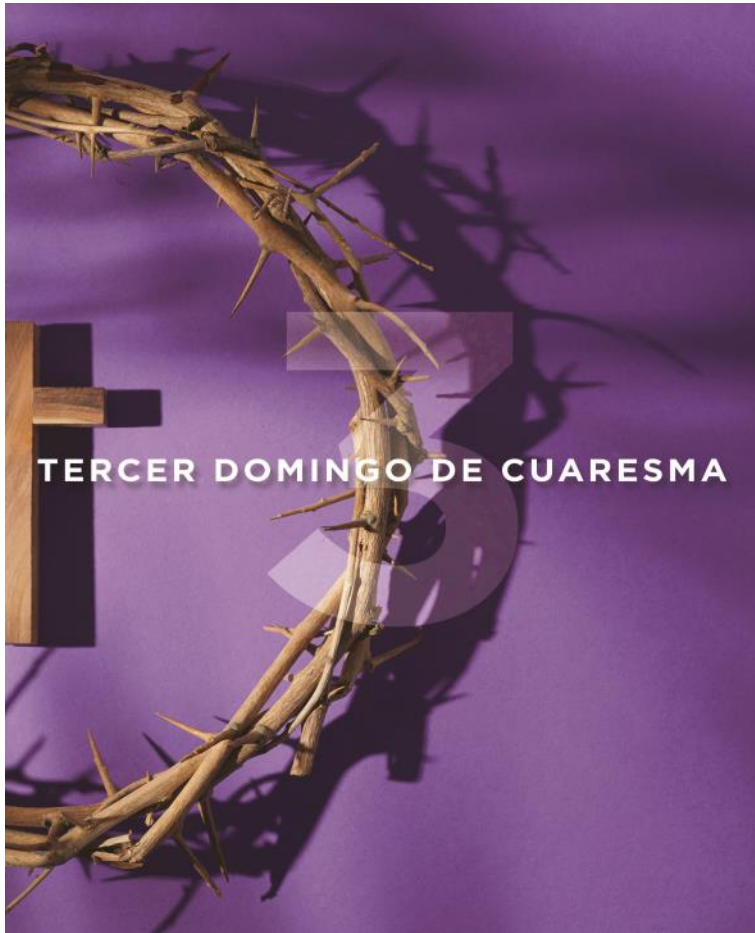
Exposition of Sacred Relics of the Saints Treasures of the Church 3/30

TERCER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

¡Espero que la Cuaresma siga yendo bien para todos! Estaré en Clanton este fin de semana, pero sé que Padre José Lody cuidará de ustedes muy bien. Asegúrese de saludar a nuestro pastor asociado, ¡si aún no has tenido la oportunidad de conocerlo!

El Evangelio de hoy cuenta una parábola de Jesús sobre como la influencia de la generosidad en las prácticas de oración y ayuno de Cuaresma. Un jardinero tiene una higuera que no da fruto, por mucho que la fertilice. ¿Alguna vez has sentido que tu vida espiritual es como ese árbol? Haces mucho esfuerzo, pero las cosas son secas, por alguna razón. En ese caso, la generosidad, y especialmente las obras de misericordia corporales, podrían ser la solución.

Aquí hay una explicación de por qué, de un sermón de San Pedro Crisólogo (un obispo italiano que vivió alrededor del año 400). Escribió: “La misericordia es al ayuno como la lluvia al suelo. Por mucho que cultives tu corazón, limpies el suelo de tu naturaleza, desarraigues los vicios y siembres virtudes, si no das el agua de la misericordia, tu ayuno no dará fruto.”

El punto aquí no es que debamos vivir con miedo, preguntándonos constantemente si estamos haciendo un número suficiente de cosas buenas, sino que abrir el corazón a nuestro prójimo es una parte integral del proceso de abrir nuestro corazón a Dios. Por la intercesión de Santísima María Siempre Virgen, y de Santo Tomás nuestro patrón, abramos nuestras manos en misericordia, esta Cuaresma y siempre.
