



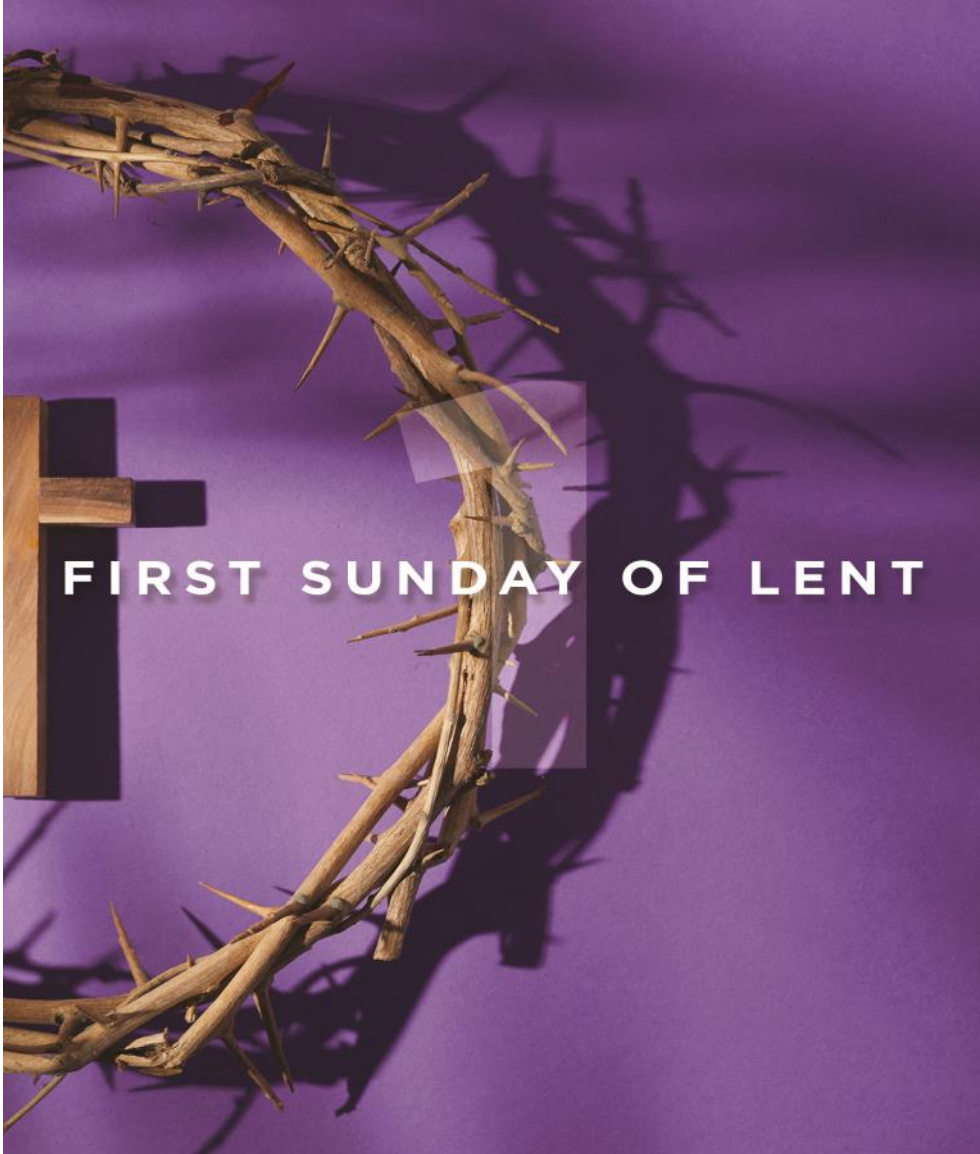

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we journey through Lent, I'd like to use this space to talk about four practices that the Church's tradition has given us to deepen our faith in this holy season: gathering, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Let's take them one at a time, starting with gathering.

The past two years have presented challenges to all forms of in-person activities. While many of the social distancing measures were necessary to protect the most vulnerable among us in the earlier stages of the pandemic, I think we've all come to a new appreciation of the importance of coming together as a community. Especially now that the latest wave of the pandemic seems to be receding, it's a good moment to be intentional once again about coming together as a Church community.

We know in faith that the presence of Christ is among us in a special way whenever we gather. We see the Lord in the faces of those around us, and when we face challenges, we're strengthened by the support of knowing that others are walking the road with us. It's true at Mass, and it's also true at many of the traditional Lenten practices: the Friday Fish Fry, when we come together to support each other in our Lenten resolutions; the Stations of the Cross, when we walk the road to Calvary with the Lord; and especially at the liturgies of Holy Week, when we join Jesus in Jerusalem for the events at the heart of our faith.

With that in mind, I'd invite all of us to pray about how we can be more intentional about making time to gather with our Church community this Lent. This discipline is no penance—it's a joy!

Resumption of Sunday Mass Obligation

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, Bishop Raica had offered a dispensation from the requirement to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for the people of the Diocese of Birmingham until May 23. On May 3, Bishop Raica promulgated a decree restoring the obligation beginning on May 24.

Every Catholic is required to attend Mass unless they are excused for a serious reason. In relation to COVID-19, serious reasons include:

- Being in a high-risk category
- Being advised by a medical doctor that it is not yet safe for you to attend
- Experiencing a significant amount of mental stress regarding returning.

It is always possible to receive a dispensation from one's Pastor. Father Jantz is happy to talk with anyone who is concerned about returning to public worship.

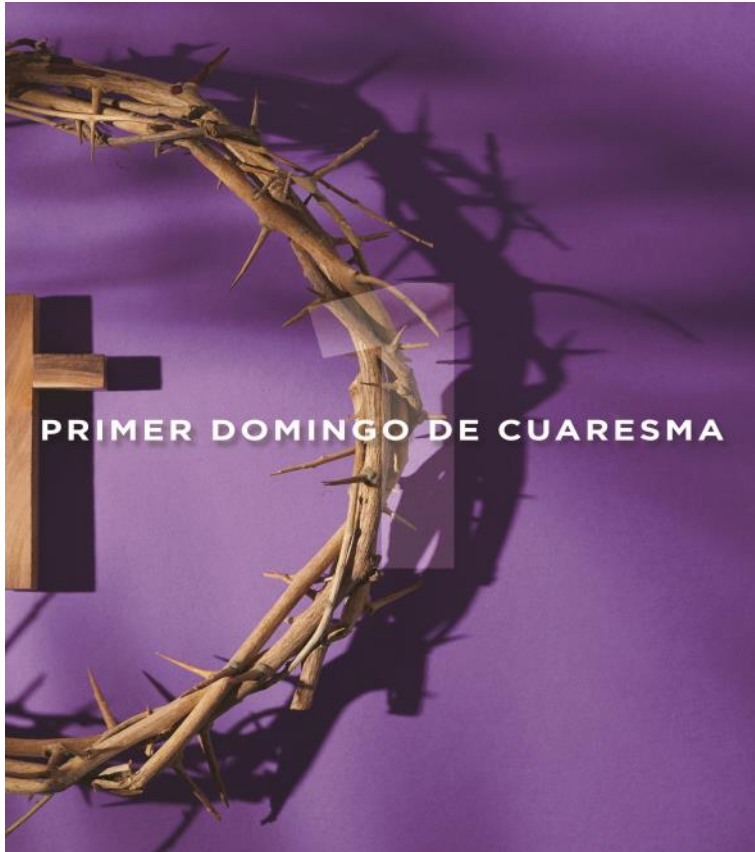
Worldwide Marriage Encounter 3/25-27

PRIMER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Al entrar en la Cuaresma, me gustaría usar este espacio para hablar sobre cuatro prácticas que la tradición de la Iglesia nos ha dado para profundizar nuestra fe en esta temporada santa: la reunión, la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. Veámoslos uno a la vez, comenzando con la reunión.

Los últimos dos años han presentado desafíos para toda actividad en persona. Si bien el distanciamiento social fuera necesario para proteger a los más vulnerables entre nosotros, creo que todos hemos llegado a una nueva apreciación de la importancia de unirnos como comunidad. Especialmente ahora que la más reciente ola de la pandemia parece estar retrocediendo, es un buen momento para volver a la intención de unirnos como comunidad de la Iglesia.

Sabemos por fe que la presencia de Cristo está entre nosotros de manera especial cada vez que nos reunimos. Vemos al Señor en los rostros de quienes nos rodean, y cuando enfrentamos desafíos, nos fortalece el apoyo de saber que otros están en el camino con nosotros. Con eso en mente, los invito a todos a orar acerca de cómo podemos ser más intencionales para hacer tiempo para reunirnos con la comunidad de nuestra Iglesia esta Cuaresma. Esta disciplina no es una penitencia, ¡es una alegría!

La Parroquia de Santo Tomás han comenzado las clases los domingos para aquellos que estén interesados en recibir sacramentos de iniciación. El proceso se llama el rito de la iniciación cristiana. Este proceso de la RCIA es para personas que no han sido bautizadas, personas que han sido bautizadas en otra tradición cristiana que desean convertirse en católicas, y católicos adultos que han sido bautizados, pero que no han sido confirmados. La RCIA ofrecerá sesiones presenciales que comenzarán en Septiembre.

Las sesiones serán los domingos de 9:30 AM a 10:45 AM. Las sesiones en inglés se reunirán en el Salón Parroquial, y las sesiones en español se reunirán en la Sala de San José. Debido a la necesidad de distanciamiento social, las únicas personas que podrán asistir a estas sesiones serán los candidatos, sus cónyuges y sus padrinos.
